Thinking Ahead

Departments Combined

Speaking of addresses, 911 addressing, Fire Inspections and Building Inspections have been combined into one department called Code Enforcement. The functions of the three departments were so intertwined and related that it just made sense to have all those in one place, so now when you go in the front of our Emergency Services Building, you go into the Code Enforcement office which now houses those three areas. Brian Dillon is the department head for that department. This also made it possible to keep 911 dispatch more secure as it makes entry into that portion of the building possible only if you have key-card access. Their job is hard enough without having to worry about somebody coming in on them.

Changes to VALIC (457) and 401(k)

Did you know that you may enroll in our 457 plan (VALIC) or our 401(k) plan at any time. You don't have to wait for open enrollment. Also, if you currently contribute to either of these, you may make changes any time you wish. So don't miss out on an opportunity to start saving toward your retirement or to increase your retirement contributions.

Your user name is first initial last name and xxxx (last four of social) ex jdoexxxx. HEATING SAFETY TIPS

- Heating equipment is a leading cause of home fire deaths. Half of home heating equipment fires are reported during the months of December, January, and February. Some simple steps can prevent most heating-related fires from happening.
- Keep anything that can burn at least three feet away from heating equipment, like the furnace, fireplace, wood stove, or portable space heater.
- Have a three-foot "kid-free zone" around open fires and space heaters.
- Never use your oven to heat your home.
- Have a qualified professional install stationary space heating equipment, water heaters or central heating equipment according to the local codes and manufacturer's instructions.
- Have heating equipment and chimneys cleaned and inspected every year by a qualified professional.
- Remember to turn portable heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.
- Always use the right kind of fuel, specified by the manufacturer, for fuel burning space heaters.
- Make sure the fireplace has a sturdy screen to stop sparks from flying into the room. Ashes should be cool before putting them in a metal container. Keep the container a safe distance away from your home.
- Test smoke alarms monthly.
